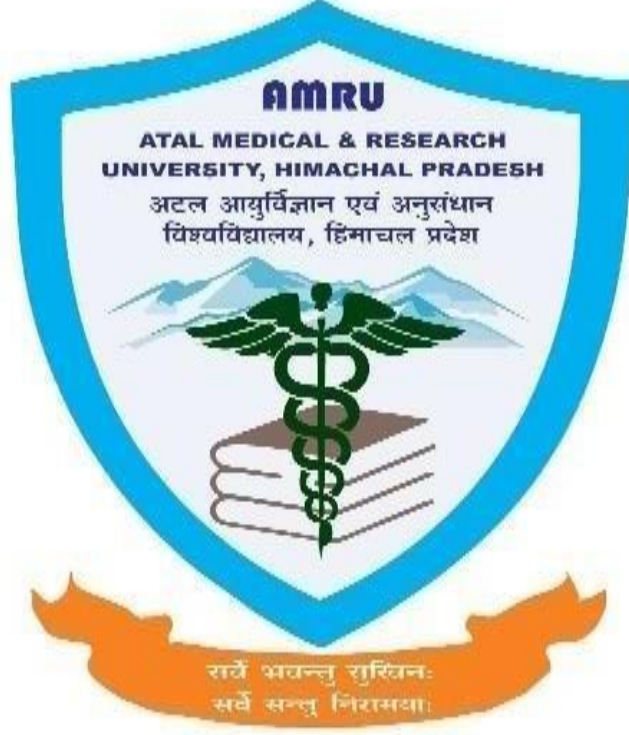

- Note:** 1. Applications for participation in MD/MS/DNB Counseling shall be invited only once before the 1st round of counseling. Applications may be invited again if the qualifying marks are reduced by the competent authority at any stage of the counseling.
2. Those Contract GDOs who are not completing the mandatory service duration and want to apply under Direct Quota shall have to submit an Affidavit claiming that if selected they will produce a relieving letter from the government at the time of admission.
3. DNB seats shall be allotted to only regular GDOs of the state of H.P, Not to contract GDOs.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

Please read the following instructions carefully:

1. The complete Prospectus for the Common/ Centralized Counseling process is available on www.amruhp.ac.in, and Directorate of Medical Education & Research, H.P. website <https://www.hp.gov.in/hpdmer/>. Candidates may download the complete copy of the text of the prospectus and may read it carefully. Thereafter, apply online within the prescribed date with successful transaction of fee and obtain the print out of confirmation copy of ONLINE application form as per instructions mentioned in the prospectus. The print out of confirmation copy of online application form is required to be submitted along with requisite certificates/documents by the candidates in person on the day of reporting for admission in the concerned provisionally allocated college.
2. The provisional State merit list of qualified NEET-PG-2024 candidates who apply (online) to the H.P. State Common/ Centralized Counseling for taking admission in PG (MD/MS/DNB) courses in Govt. and Private Medical College of the State for the academic session 2024-25 will only be drawn by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi based on NEET-PG-2024 result data and the service incentives provided by the DHS, HP. The application forms of candidates, who are not found qualified in NEET-PG-2024, shall be rejected without any notice and names of such candidates will not figure in the State merit list. The final H.P. state merit list of desirous applicants shall be displayed as per schedule in prospectus or as and when provided by National Board of Examination for those candidates who applied online with successful transaction of fee. The application fee shall not be refunded in any case. Hence, NEET-PG-2024 non-qualified candidates need not apply for the H.P. State Common/ Centralized Counseling.
3. The final submission of online application will be considered incomplete if there is failure to complete any of the steps for online registration for the Counselling or non-payment of the fee as per requirement of online process. Such incomplete applications shall be rejected. Mere deduction of fee does not mean that the online application form has been submitted successfully. In the event of failure of fee transfer to the specified account and non-generation of confirmation copy of the online application form, the Common/Centralized Counselling committee shall, in no way be responsible.
4. Generation of confirmation copy confirms the correctness and final submission of application form. If confirmation copy has not been generated, this means that application has not been submitted successfully which will lead to rejection.
5. Qualifying criteria for applying for Common/ Centralized Counseling is as under: -

(i) General Category	50 th percentile
(ii) SC/ST/OBC (including person with bench mark disability)	40 th percentile
(iii) UR-Person with Disability	45 th percentile
7. The candidate(s) found ineligible at any stage shall have no claim for admission or continuation of PG degree (MD/MS/DNB) course even if he /she has qualified the NEET-PG-2024.
8. All desirous eligible candidates, Direct and In-service GDOs who fulfill the prescribed eligibility criteria and other conditions of the Prospectus may apply through online mode only, by using website www.amruhp.ac.in for seeking admission to PG (MD/MS/DNB) courses in different Govt/Private Medical Colleges situated in the State of Himachal Pradesh in the different specialties.
9. **Category once opted will not be changed.**
10. Online Counseling for admission will be held as per the schedule in prospectus or schedule notified by the Common /Centralized Counselling as the case may be, no separate intimation

will be sent. However, candidates are advised to regularly stay in touch with the websites, regarding the important dates to identify the current status of Centralized /Common Counseling for admission.

11. All matters and disputes related to PG (MD/MS/DNB) counseling are subject to legal jurisdiction of courts in Shimla only
12. The Postgraduate Courses/Seats may be added, altered or deleted as per recommendations of Govt. of India/ National Medical Commission/National Board of Examinations.
13. The number of seats may be increased/ decreased as per exigencies of circumstance as per the directions of Govt. of India/ National Medical Commission/ National Board of Examinations.
14. Any Postgraduate Degree seat(s) left unfilled in any regular session will not be carried forward to the next or subsequent academic session.
15. The concerned Institution will not be responsible if the PG (MD/MS) seats are not recognized during the tenure of PG Course/ after completion of PG Course. The candidates who opted for permitted seats shall have no right, title or claim for recognition of seats.
16. As per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme court of India dated 9.5.2017 passed in writ petition (Civil) No.267/2017-DAR-US-SIAM Educational Trust and ors. Vs. Medical Council of India, "After 2nd round of Counselling for All India Quota seats, the students who take admission on All India Quota seats should not be allowed/ permitted to vacate the seats". Keeping in view the said directions, candidates are advised to take a calculated decision of continuing in 2nd round of All India Quota as they would not be permitted to resign from 2nd round of AIQ.
17. Similarly the candidates admitted under 50% State Quota in Govt. Medical Colleges & Management Quota in Private Medical College of the State and intend to participate in Stray round are required to surrender PG seat (already occupied) within stipulated period as specified by the Common/ Centralized Counselling Committee separately through notice. In case candidates do not surrender the seat within stipulated period, he /she will not be eligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy round.

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1. Introduction

The Department of Medical Education and Research, Himachal Pradesh shall conduct online Common/Centralized Counselling for filling-up of 50% State Quota PG (MD/MS/DNB) degree seats in Government Medical Colleges of the State and all seats in private Medical Colleges of the State as per State merit drawn by the Controller of Examination, Atal Medical & Research University, Mandi at Ner Chowk –cum- Member Secretary Common/Centralized Counselling Committee, on the basis of ranking/marks of **NEET-PG-2024** of those candidates who have applied on the prescribed application form within stipulated date as mentioned in the Prospectus for admission to PG (MD/MS/DNB) Degree Courses in Government and Private Medical Colleges of the State for academic SESSION 2024-2025.

Indira Gandhi Medical College Shimla, Dr. RP Govt. Medical College Kangra at Tanda, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Govt. Medical College, Mandi at Ner Chowk, Dr. Y.S. Parmar Government Medical College, Nahan, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru Govt. Medical College, Chamba and Dr. RK Govt. Medical College Hamirpur are affiliated to the Atal Medical & Research University, Mandi at Ner Chowk, and admissions are made to the courses recognized/permitted by the National Medical Commission (erstwhile Medical Council of India)/ National Board of Examinations/ Atal Medical & Research University, Mandi at Ner Chowk, strictly in accordance with the admission criteria laid down by the National Medical Commission and the H.P. State Government.

The Maharishi Markandeshwer Medical College, Kumarhatti, Distt. Solan is affiliated with Maharishi Markandeshwer University, Solan. This Private Medical College has been included in the Prospectus only for the purpose of making allotment of seats through Common/ Centralized Counselling Committee on the basis of merit of qualified candidates of NEET-PG-2024 drawn by the Controller of Examination, Atal Medical and Research University -cum- Member Secretary Counselling Committee as per directions of the Hon'ble Apex Court/ Govt. of India, MoH&FW, New Delhi /National Medical Commission (erstwhile MCI).

Other issues like bond conditions, stipend, details of College, Hostel fee and Registration charges, examinations fee and schedule of examinations etc. will be available in the Prospectus of MMMC& H, Solan which will be issued by the college concerned separately. Therefore, candidates who intend to take admission in the said private College through Common/Centralized Counseling are directed to go through the Prospectus of the college concerned.

Duration of Courses:-

P.G. Degree Course (MD/MS/DNB) 3 years

2. Eligibility and Selection Criteria in respect of In-Service GDO(s) as notified by the Government of HP vide Notification No. Hfw-B(F)4-9/2017-II Dated 27.2.2019 and subsequently amended vide notification no HFW-B(F)4-9/2017-II dated 4.09.2023.

2.1 Incentive for pursuing Post Graduation within the State through NEET-PG-2024:

There shall be no requirement for a NOC to appear in NEET-PG-2024 for any of the GDO candidates.

2.2 There shall be requirement of an Incentive Certificate for availing the incentive for serving in the State as a GDO provided that such Incentive Certificate shall be issued to only those GDO who have completed mandatory service period without any break or unauthorized absence on the date of declaration of result of NEET-PG-2024 i.e. 23 August, 2024. Further provided that this Incentive Certificate shall be valid only for appearing in the State Quota Counselling.

2.3 The application for issuance of Incentive Certificate shall be made by the desirous GDO to the concerned Chief Medical Officer under whom he/she is currently serving. The application shall be made on a prescribed format as Appendix- 4, 4(A) & 4(B). The concerned Chief Medical Officer shall verify the service particulars of the GDO from the maintained service record and send the Incentive Certificate for counter signature of the Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh.

2.4 The GDOs shall be entitled for an incentive in terms of percentage of marks obtained in NEET-PG-2024 based on their services rendered in various field postings as per PG policy notified by the State Government vide Notification No. HFW-B(F)4-9/2017-II dated 27/02/2019 (Modified provision as per Govt. notification dated 5.03.2022) and subsequently amended vide notification no. HFW-B(F)4-9/2017-II dated 4.09.2023.

In case a Medical Officer has served in more than one category of area, the mandatory service period will be calculated for all the areas separately on pro-rata basis using the following formula.

$$\text{Mandatory Service Period for a particular fieldposting} = \frac{\text{Duration served (in days)}}{\text{Prescribed Mandatory Service (in years) * 365}}$$

If the total of all the category of areas adds up to one or more the candidate shall be eligible for the State Quota seats

The percentage incentive shall be computed on pro-rata basis for the actual duration of service rendered **beyond the mandatory period in a particular field posting** as per the following formula.

$$\text{Incentive percentage for a particular field posting} = \frac{\text{Duration served (in days) beyond the mandatory period}}{365} \times \text{Prescribed incentive for particular Institution)$$

In case a particular GDO has been posted at one particular station but he is deputed for some period to another station, the actual duration served at a particular field posting will be taken into account for the calculation of incentive. This incentive shall be available to only those GDOs who are in the active service of the State in a continuous manner, and for the purpose of computing the incentive the present continuous service shall be taken into account; meaning that, any doctor who has served as a GDO in the past but has subsequently resigned shall not be eligible to avail benefit of this incentive on the basis of any previous service. Similarly, if he/she subsequently joins as GDO again, the incentive will be calculated taking into consideration the latest period of service reckoned from the date when he/she is in continuous service without any break. This incentive will be subject to maximum of 30% in terms of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 16th August 2016 in Civil Appeal No.: 8047/2016- State of U.P. & Ors. Versus Dr. Dinesh Singh Chauhan and as per National Medical Commission (erstwhile Medical Council of India Regulations).

2.5 For the purpose of computation of incentive by the Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh the cutoff date shall be the date of declaration of NEET-PG-2024 result **i.e.** 23 August, 2024.

2.6 The incentive applicable for each field posting for a particular candidate shall be calculated, summed up and rounded off to three decimal points by the Director of Health Services. The Director of Health Services shall compile the list of all candidates who have applied for issuance of Incentive Certificate along-with their NEET-PG-2024 Roll number and communicate the entitled incentive (till three decimal points) in respect of each candidate to the COE, AMRU, Ner Chowk -cum-Member Secretary, Common/ Centralized Counseling Committee for communicating them to NBE, New Delhi for drawing up a combined merit list in respect of GDO and Direct candidates. The individual original Incentive Certificate shall be filed in the personal record of the GDO.

2.7 (i) No incentive shall be applicable for those GDOs who are appearing for the All India counseling.

(ii) For the purpose of incentive, this Policy shall be applicable henceforth; meaning thereby the GDOs who have served in field postings in the past will be awarded incentive as per previous notification dated 20-03-2017 (and amended from time to time) and any GDO who is serving/will serve in any field posting will be entitled for incentive as prescribed in this Policy from now onwards.

2.8 Sponsorship

(i) After the counseling, the GDOs desirous of pursuing Post-Graduation within or outside the State shall apply for sponsorship to the Director of Health Service, Himachal Pradesh. The pre-requisites for issuance of sponsorship certificate shall be the following:

(ii) For Post -Graduation within the State

(a) The candidate should have been eligible to be issued incentive certificate as per the provision of the PG policy.

(b) Fulfillment of all formalities as per clause-10.2 of the Prospectus.

3. Eligibility and Selection Criteria in respect of Direct Candidates for 50% State Quota Seats

(i) The graduates of Medical Colleges of Himachal Pradesh.

(ii) Bonafide Himachali who have done MBBS from any institute recognized/ permitted by NMC.

(iii) Children of H.P. Government Employees /Employees of Autonomous Bodies wholly or partially financed by H.P. Government getting admission to MBBS course through NEET or any other All India entrance Examination, in NMC/ G.O.I. recognized Medical Colleges in India.

3.1 Candidates seeking admission shall:

3.1.1 Possess MBBS degree of Himachal Pradesh University or any other University recognized by Medical Council of India.

3.1.2 **Have completed Compulsory Internship by 15th August 2024 as per Information Bulletin issued by the Asstt. Director General, Directorate General of Health Services Medical Counselling Committee, New Delhi for Academic Session 2024.**

3.1.3 Have obtained full registration either from National Medical Commission /Medical Council of India or any of the State Medical Council.

3.1.4 The candidate possessing foreign qualifications (MBBS degree) will have to produce the certificate of having passed the NBE examination as well as Certificate of Recognition by NMC of the Institution from which he/she has obtained the MBBS Degree at the time of applying for online Counselling

3.1.5 The candidates working on Regular/Contract basis and not possessing the requisite qualifying service as defined at clause 2 and its sub clauses will be considered as direct candidates subject to the conditions that they fulfill the conditions as laid down in clause 3.

3.1.6 Candidates applying for direct-group including those covered under 3.1.5 above are required to enclose an affidavit with the application form duly attested from the competent authority on non-judicial stamp paper (the specimen of affidavit is attached at Appendix- 3).

Note:- For getting admission in Management Quota of Private Medical College through Common/Centralized Counselling, Candidates who are not Bonafide/Domicile Himachali can also apply by using online counseling website www.amruhp.ac.in

3.2 At the end of 3rd round of Common/ Centralized Counselling, in case, the eligible candidate to the extent of reservation in any quota (Direct/GDO) are not available or seats remain unfilled, the vacant seat shall be filled by making them available to the respective reserved category of other quota (Direct/GDO). If seats remain vacant even after this process, the vacant seats shall be filled up by making them available to other categories as given below:

- (i) The vacant /unfilled seats of SC category shall be filled up from amongst the eligible ST category candidates.
- (ii) The vacant /unfilled seats of ST category shall be filled up from amongst the eligible SC category candidates.
- (iii) In case, the eligible candidates are not available in the above two reserved categories in the above manner, the vacant seats shall then be filled up from amongst the eligible unreserved candidates.
- (iv) The vacant /unfilled seats of Person with disability shall be filled –up from General category candidates.
- (v) The candidature of SC/ST candidates belonging to other state (non- HP) will only be considered for General category by virtue of their General combined merit for allocation of State Quota seats in Govt. /private Medical Colleges of the State.
- (vi) As per 40 point reservation roster there is no specific point earmarked to OBC, hence OBC candidates shall be considered against the point of UR according to General combined merit.

Note: Since NRI quota is applicable only in private Medical College, hence left out NRI quota seats shall be converted to management quota and filled in 3rd round

3.3 Eligibility criteria for NRI quota seats in r/o private Medical College of the State shall be determined on the basis of orders passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 22.8.2017 in Writ Petition (Civil) No. No.689 of 2017, titled Consortium of Deemed Universities in Karnataka (CODEUNIK) & Anr. Versus Union of India and as per orders passed by the Hon'ble High Court of H.P. on 13.11.2020 passed in CWP No. 4119 of 2020 –MMU, Solan Vs. State of H.P.

3.3.1 NRI Category: The NEET-PG-2024 qualified candidate who are claiming under NRI category shall satisfy the following:

i. Applicant shall be NRI citizen by himself / herself.

Or

ii. Applicants' parents (parent of legally adopted child also is eligible) shall be NRI and shall have the annual income sufficient to support the course of study of his/her ward.

Note: The transaction of fee deposition should be from Foreign Bank in \$

3.3.2. NRI sponsored Category:

In the event of non-availability of adequate number of eligible NRI candidates who fulfill the aforesaid eligibility criteria, NRI sponsored candidates will be considered for allocation of seats in order of merit –cum-preference of Speciality subject to fulfillment of following conditions:

a. The sponsor shall be blood relation to the applicant i.e. Brother or their children, sister or their children, maternal uncle or his children, maternal aunt or her children, paternal uncle or his children, paternal aunt or her children, maternal grandfather, maternal grandmother, paternal grandfather and paternal grandmother. The genealogical tree certificate or equivalent issued by the Tahsildar and above, for establishing the relationship of the sponsor and the applicant shall be required. (Legally adopted child shall also be eligible)

b.) NRI status certificate issued by the Indian embassy under seal or overseas citizen of India (OCI) or PIO status certificate issued by the competent authority.

c.) Copy of the passport with valid visa.

d.) The sponsor with student / visiting visa or temporary visa of any nature is not eligible to sponsor.

e.) Shall have the annual income sufficient to support the course of study of his/her ward.

3.4 Documents to be submitted

3.4.1 Documents to be submitted along with the application and at time of submission of online application form for NRI candidate :

- (a) NEET PG-2024 result card
- (b) Final Prof. marks sheet, proof of aggregate total marks & MBBS degree.
- (c) Proof of date of birth and place of birth.
- (d) Citizenship status of the candidate (The status shall be considered on the day of advertisement)

3.4.2 Documents required to be submitted with application for NRI parents :

(i) Recent NRI status certificate of the parent issued by the respective embassy with their seal or OCI/ PIO/ Permanent citizenship certificate from the competent authority (The status of the sponsor shall be considered on the day of advertisement).

(ii) Employment certificate of NRI parent. In case of self-employment, nature of business, annual income and proof thereof to be furnished and copy of the income tax returns filed for the previous financial year.

3.4.3 Documents required to be submitted with application for NRI sponsored category :

(i). NEET- PG-2024 result card

(ii) Final Prof. marks sheet, proof of aggregate total marks & MBBS degree.

(iii) Proof of date of birth and place of birth.

(iv) Genealogical tree certificate or equivalence issued by Tehsildar and above authority.

3.4.4 Documents of NRI sponsor to be submitted :-

(i) NRI status certificate (Citizenship/Residence or equivalent)

(ii) Copy of the passport with valid visa

(iii) Employment certificate

3.5 Selection criteria

- (i) A separate merit list will be drawn to fill-up NRI quota seats through Common/ Centralized Counseling Committee on the basis of NEET-PG-2024 rank/score.
- (ii) After all the NRI category (NEET-PG-2024 qualified & eligible) candidates get admitted, the remaining vacancies of NRI shall be filled-up with NRI sponsored category.

4. Specialty-wise details of Recognized/ Permitted Degree Seats

As per National Medical Commission, New Delhi Notification F. No. CDN-19012/5/2023-Coord-NMC dated 29.12.2023 Chapter III Clause 3.1 (IV) all the PG (MD/MS) seats will be considered as recognized. The PG MD/MS/DNB seats available in Govt/ Private Medical colleges are as under:

5.1 40 Point Reservation Roster

(i) 40 point reservation roster will be applied in respect of allotment of seats/specialties amongst General, SC, ST, PWD & EWS categories in the following manner.

- (ii) From the academic SESSION 2024-2025, 40 point reservation roster shall be applied afresh for DNB Seats.
- (iii) The Common/ Centralized Counselling shall be conducted online in order of merit – cum choice of specialty and 40 point and six point reservation rosters. In case reserved category candidates (SC/ST/Person with Disability /EWS) stands in General combined merit list then he/she can opt for any seat that falls under General category points by virtue of his/her general combined merit. In that event point of General category will be treated exhausted.
- (iv) 5% seats of the annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by persons with Benchmark disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with disability Act, 2016 and as per the directions of the National Medical Commission / Medical Council of India based on merit list of National Eligibility –cum- Entrance Test -2024 for admission to Post Graduate Courses in Govt. and Private Medical Colleges of the State. Person with disability candidates who intend take admission in Govt. and Private Medical Colleges of the State through Common/ Centralized Counselling have to obtain the certificate of disability as per Appendix- 4 from the Medical Board of Indira Gandhi Medical College, & Hospital Shimla and Dr. Rajendra Prasad Govt. Medical College & Hospital, Kangra at Tanda. The specified disability as prescribed by the National Medical Commission / Medical Council of India is attached with the Appendix-4 (Disability Certificate).
- (v) If Person with disability stands in General combined merit list, he/she can opt for seat earmarked to General category candidate by virtue of his /her General combined merit. In that event point of General category will be treated exhausted. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective Category i.e. General Category.
- (vi) One seat each in Govt. Medical Colleges has been reserved for Single Girl Child category as per approval conveyed by the Government vide letter No. HFW- B(B) 12-4/2013-loose dated 11.10.2017. The reservation will be provided to single girl child in the following manner:

“If, single girl child category candidate stands in General Combined Merit list then she can opt for any seat that falls under general category points by virtue of her general combined merit. In that event point of general category will be treated exhausted. If, single girl child category candidate does not stand in the general combined merit, in that event last seat of general category of the concerned government Medical College which will be available during the Counseling shall be allotted to the single girl child to maintain the reservation to single girl child”.

(vii) **Definitions of Single Girl Child:**

Single Girl Child means parents having a single girl child without any sibling subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria as prescribed for State Quota seats, under this, category, the candidate has to produce to a certificate as per Appendix-6.

(viii) **Definitions of EWS:-** Economically Weaker Sections(EWSs) means the persons who fulfilled the criteria as prescribed by Government of Himachal Pradesh Department of Personnel (AP-III) vide letter No. PER(AP)-C-B(12)-1/2019 dated 11.06.2019. As per aforesaid letter, the persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs, and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.4.00 lakh (Rupees four lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:

More than 1 hectare of Agriculture Land in rural areas and 500 M2 land in urban areas;

Residential flat/ house of more than 2500 square feet in rural/ urban areas;

Family of income tax payee;

Family of Regular/Contract employees of the Central Government, State Government, Board, Corporation and autonomous bodies and Public Sector Undertakings etc.

Note: 1. In the academic session 2024-25, reservation to EWS shall be provided as per direction of the Central Govt. for which proposal with regard to increase of 10% seats under EWS scheme has already been submitted to the Board of Governors in Super-session of Medical Council of India New Delhi.

2. The candidates claiming the benefit of reservation under EWS category is required to submit the certificate on the prescribed format **as per Appendix -7(A & B) (as applicable)** duly issued by the competent authority of the State of Himachal Pradesh.

3. Since in Private Medical College, EWS Quota is not applicable. Therefore, EWS point falling in Private Medical College shall be allotted to General Category candidate.

On clicking the Verify button, the candidate will get OTP on the registered email id, by entering the OTP in the required text box the email id will get verified. Insert the captcha code to get yourself registered.
2. Use your authenticated Mobile Number & e-mail ID for the registration. Due to onetime registration, candidate must retain the system generated credentials for future login.
3. Photograph should be taken on or after 1st June 2024 upto the size of **40kb**.
 - The **focus needs to be on face** (80% face coverage, ears clearly visible, on white background).
 - Spectacles are allowed only if being used regularly.

6. **Uploading relevant Documents**
7. **Payment of Fees**

The applicant must fill all the details as asked on each screen and proceed further step by step. Once all the details are filled, and submitted, the candidate should take a print of admission form.

- 6.3. (i) After successful remittance of fees, system will generate print out of the confirmation copy of the online application form and the same shall be submitted along with Allotment letter and other relevant certificates/documents by the candidate in person on the day of reporting in the allotted college.

Failure to complete any of the steps of online application form and payment of fee as per requirements of online process, final submission of online application will remain incomplete and unsuccessful.

- (ii) Generation of confirmation page confirms the correctness and final submission of application form. If confirmation page has not been generated, this means that application has not been submitted successfully.

Note:- Online application form registered within due date without successful transaction of requisite fee or without completion of ONLINE process of application form, will be rejected without any intimation. Such candidates will be required to fill another form if allowed if they wish to appear in subsequent rounds of counseling.

8. Common/ Centralized Counseling

8.1 There will be online Counseling system to make the provisional allocation of the available seats (MD/MS/DNB) to the eligible candidates in order of merit-cum- choices /preferences of the **Specialty, College and category/Quota**. The online admission application form will be filled by the candidate within the stipulated period by using University website www.amruhp.ac.in. **Online Applications shall be invited only once before the first round of the counseling. The list of participant along with their service incentives shall be provide to Nation Board of Examination, New Delhi, who will prepare the overall merit list for Himachal Pradesh that will be displayed on the AMRU portal before choice filling.** After this the candidates will be able to fill the choices/ preferences of Specialty, Colleges and Quota within the given time.

8.2 The admission process in the Government Medical Colleges and Private Medical College (State, Management & NRI Quota) shall be completed by online allotment within the prescribed schedule through the Centralized/ Common Counseling Committee constituted by the Government of Himachal Pradesh under the Chairmanship of the Director Medical Education & Research, H.P. Shimla. All the Principals of the Medical Colleges including Joint/Additional Director, Directorate of Medical Education & Research, Himachal Pradesh are its members and the Controller of Examinations, Atal Medical and Research University HP is its Member Secretary.

8.3 After provisional allocation of seats in the first round of counseling, candidates would be able to download provisional admission letters from the website of the university after login to their account. The candidates will be required to report to the Principals of the respective college along with requisite original documents and print out of application form and allotment letter. Candidates will also be required to deposit one self-attested copy of all these documents.

8.4 The eligibility of the candidates will be determined by the Admission Committee constituted and chaired by the Principals of the respective college. The Admission Committee will recommend admission of the candidate after ensuring eligibility, verifying documents, medical fitness and deposition of fees. If the candidate does not follow the aforesaid process within stipulated time the allotment shall be cancelled automatically without any intimation to the candidate. This seat shall be declared vacant in subsequent rounds of the counseling and penalty (if applicable) shall be imposed as per provisions of the prospectus.

8.5 After completion of 1st round of Common /Centralized Counselling, the 2nd round of Common/ Centralized Counselling shall be conducted by the university as per schedule prescribed in the Prospectus or schedule issued by the Counselling Committee as the case may be. No fresh candidate shall be allowed to register in this round. The registered candidates will be required to fill up choices/preferences of Speciality, college(s) and categories / quota afresh within stipulated period for provisional allocation against vacant seats or the seats falling vacant due to change over of the Speciality. If candidate is satisfied with his/her seat allocated during the 1st round of online Counselling, he/she is not required to participate in the 2nd round of online Counselling. In case he/she wants up gradation / change of the Speciality, then he/she will have to submit fresh preferences in 2nd round failing which the seat allocated in the 1st round will be treated as final. Change of Speciality /up gradation from one Speciality to another and from one Medical College to another shall be allowed during the 2nd round of Centralized /Common Counselling in order of merit as per the availability of seats and choices filled by the candidates. During the 2nd round of Counseling, if an admitted candidate of round -1, who participated in 2nd round is not getting up-gradation then he/she will be allowed to retain the seat with category allotted in Round-1 and hence allocation shall be done only of available vacancy in Round-2. The vacant seats in second round will be filled category-wise. Allocation shall be done of only available vacancy position of round 2. Roster point exhausted in First round will not be opened if the candidate does not vacate this point.

8.6 Following the filling of choices, the seats shall be allocated based on merit and choices. In 2nd round of counseling the candidates will be required to deposit the following amount of Token Fee for filling choices of speciality/ college and quota. The amount of this Token money shall be as under:

- Government Medical College = Rs. 39,000/- (full 1st year tuition fee) .
- Private Medical College = 5 Lacs (State Quota)
- Private Medical College = 5 Lacs (Management Quota)

Note: In case aforementioned fee is not deposited by a candidate, he/she will not be able to fill choices for 2nd round.

8.7 The Token Amount of fees deposited by the candidate shall be refunded to him/her if he/she is not allocated any seat in any round. The Token Amount shall be forfeited if the candidate does not join on allocated seat. If a candidate deposits the Token Amount more than once then Token Amount of that round in which he/she was not allocated any seat will be refunded and the Token Amount of those rounds in which he/she did not join on allocated seat shall be forfeited. The Token Amount of fee of admitted candidates shall be transferred in the account of the concerned college on receipt of claim from the Principal of that Institute. Token amount will be refunded only in the account from which payment of this amount was done therefore all applicants are advised to pay token amount of fee from their own account or parents account. The candidate shall be required to fill the details of the account from which the Token amount was paid. If the refund of Token money done by the AMRU fails because of any reason the refund shall be processed in this account. AMRU may ask the candidates to fill an online claim form available on their login page to claim refund of token amount deposited by them if the automatic refund process fails because of any reason.

8.8 At the end of 3rd round of Common/ Centralized Counselling, in case, the eligible candidate to the extent of reservation in any quota (Direct/GDO) are not available or seats remain unfilled, the vacant seat shall be filled by making them available to the respective reserved category of other quota (Direct/GDO). If seats remain vacant even after this process, the vacant seats shall be filled up by making them available to other categories as given below:

- (i) The vacant /unfilled seats of SC category shall be filled up from amongst the eligible ST category candidates.
- (ii) The vacant /unfilled seats of ST category shall be filled up from amongst the eligible SC category candidates.
- (iii) In case, the eligible candidates are not available in the above two reserved categories in the above manner, the vacant seats shall then be filled up from amongst the eligible unreserved candidates.
- (iv) The vacant /unfilled seats of Person with disability shall be filled –up from General category candidates.
- (v) The candidature of SC/ST candidates belonging to other state (non- HP) will only be considered for General category by virtue of their General combined merit for allocation of State Quota seats in Govt. /private Medical Colleges of the State.
- (vi) As per 40 point reservation roster there is no specific point earmarked to OBC, hence OBC candidates shall be considered against the point of UR according to General combined merit.

Note: Since NRI quota is applicable only in private Medical College, hence left out NRI quota seats shall be converted to management quota and filled in 3rd round.

8.9 It is pertinent to mention here that the candidates can fill the choices of colleges **Speciality/ categories /quota** which are not reflecting in the vacancy position of seats during 2nd round of Counselling as few seats **may arise due to changeover of Speciality/College by candidates who have already occupied a PG (MD/MS seats in 1st round.** In view thereof, seats of any College / Speciality may become vacant in **2nd round due to above mentioned changes.** Hence, it is not mandatory to fill only those choices/preferences which are reflected in the vacancy position of seats. Therefore, candidates are advised to fill the preferences/choices of colleges as per their choice. The seats in 2nd round will be allocated as per availability of seats in order of merit- cum - choice/preference submitted by the candidate.

8.10 After completion of 2nd round of counseling, the 3rd round of counseling shall be conducted for the registered candidates. No fresh candidates shall be allowed to register for the 3rd round. Registered candidates shall be required to fill up fresh choices/preferences of course, college(s) and quota within stipulated period for provisional allocation against vacant seats. All candidates whose names figured in the AMRU merit list notified by the University are entitled to fill up the preferences of college/course/quota for 3rd round of counseling. If the candidate is satisfied with his/ her seat allocated during the 1st or 2nd round of online counselling, he/she is not required to participate in the subsequent round of online counselling. Shifting/up-gradation from one Medical College/Course to another college and course shall also be made during the 3rd round of counselling. Candidates willing to participate in the 3rd round of counselling are required to remit the Token amount as described for 2nd Round while filling their preferences of college/course online, failing which no seats shall be allocated to them. However, the candidates already admitted during the 1st or 2nd round of counseling are not required to remit the token amount of fee while filling the preferences for 3rd round of counseling.

8.11 The candidates can fill the choices of colleges, course/quota which is not reflecting in the vacancy position of seats, as few seats may arise due to shifting of candidates during 3rd round of counseling from one college/course to another as per their choices/preferences by vacating the already occupied seat of 2nd round of counseling. The seats in 3rd round will be allocated as per availability of seats as per merit- cum -choice/preference submitted by the candidate.

8.12 During the 3rd round of Counseling, if an admitted candidate of round-2, who has participated in 3rd round is not getting up gradation then he/she will be allowed to retain the seat with category allotted in Round-2. The vacant seats of 2nd round will be displayed and will be filled category-wise in 3rd round. After category wise allocation the remaining vacant seats shall be filled in 3rd round only as described in Clause 7.8.

8.13 After completion of 1st, 2nd & 3rd round of counseling, the schedule for Stray Round of counseling shall be issued by the University on the University website www.amruhp.ac.in. There will be no fresh registration for the candidates. Registered candidates who are not admitted in any college and are eligible for participating in the Stray Round of online counseling are required to fill up fresh choices/preferences of course, college and quota in the online application form within stipulated period for provisional allocation against vacant seats along with requisite amount as prescribed for token amount of fee, as applicable. No inter-shifting from one Medical College or Course to another Medical College or Course shall be allowed during the Stray Round of Counseling as per MCC guidelines. However, shifting for up-gradation of course and quota from Private Medical Colleges to Govt. Medical College in order of merit-cum-choices/preferences of the course, college & quota shall be allowed.

It is clarified here that since all the remaining seats had already been filled after converting them to un-reserved category, based on merit -cum- preference, the vacancy of category will only arise if the candidate allotted seat under some reserved category does not join. At the end of Stray round of Common/Centralized Counselling, the remaining reserved seats will be converted to unreserved as per Counselling procedure like in 3rd round.

Note: (i) Candidates who had not participated/allocated seats in the 1st, 2nd & 3rd rounds of counseling can also participate in the Stray Round of counseling as per their AMRU merit Rank.

(ii) Candidates are advised to remain in touch with the AMRU websites regularly for any change in the counselling /admission process as well as latest updates till the last closing date of admission and University shall in no way be responsible for non- communication on this account.

8.14 Pursuant to the judgment passed by the Hon'ble High Court of H.P. on 10.07.2020 in CWP No. 2160 of 2020- Gunjan Thakur and Others Vs. State of H.P. and others , all the candidates who applied for 2nd or subsequent rounds (Mop-up and Stray Vacancy) of Common/Centralized Counselling for the first time and those who participated from earlier rounds will be considered together for allocation of seats in that particular round based on a common merit.

8.15 Candidates are advised to remain in touch with the online counseling website www.amruhp.ac.in regularly for any change in the counseling/admission process as well as latest updates up to the last closing date of admission and Counselling Committee shall in no way be responsible for non-communication on this account.

8.16 The Himachali Bonafide candidates who fulfil the eligibility criteria of State Quota seat as prescribed in the Prospectus, admitted under management quota in the private Medical College can also be up graded to the State Quota Seat during the 2nd round of Counseling, if he/she applied to the state quota seat in the Colleges concerned against vacant/drop-out seats, if any, in order of merit as the case, may be, subject to fulfilment of the eligibility criteria as prescribed for State Quota seats.

8.17 The final eligibility of the candidates shall be determined after verification of all original documents strictly as per provisions of the prospectus by the Scrutiny Committee constituted by the Principal of the concerned Medical College. However, it will be the entire responsibility of the candidates concerned to supply correct and authenticated information on the online Application form. The Application Forms of ineligible candidates will be rejected by the Common /Centralized Counseling Committee. No request for change of category once opted/filled in the online Application Form after issuance of category-wise merit list during the course of Online Counselling will be entertained under any circumstances. It is further clarified that the candidates will be allocated seats provisionally on the basis of their merit rank-cum-choices/preferences. As far as their final eligibility is concerned, the Counselling Committee shall, in no way be responsible, if they are found to be ineligible at the time of admission in the allocated college, leading to cancellation of their seat or any other consequence emanating from the same.

8.18 It will be the sole responsibility of the Principal of the colleges concerned to admit the eligible candidates to the course as per provisions of the Prospectus. The Principal must ensure that he/ she is clear about the prescribed eligibility criteria of the State Common/Centralized Counselling Prospectus-2024-25 before admitting the candidate to the course. Candidates are also

requested to ensure that they are eligible for the course they are going to take admission. In the event of his/her ineligibility detected at later stage, his/her admission shall be cancelled without any notice. Any wrong or misleading entry or documentation in the form will lead to the rejection of the candidature at any stage without assigning any reason for which the candidate(s) would be solely **responsible along with its legal consequences and liabilities of entire course fee to the concerned institutions**

8.19 Candidate who brings incomplete documents/certificate(s) at the time of reporting for verification of documents at the level of college for admission, his/her candidature is liable to be rejected without any notice by the College Scrutiny Committee. Provided further that in the admission process, the decision of the Director Medical Education & Research, H.P.-cum-Chairman Centralized /Common Counseling Committee shall be final and binding upon all concerned.

8.20 The candidate (s) found ineligible at any stage shall have no claim for admission or continuation of PG courses even if he/she qualifies in the **NEET-PG-2024**

8.21 In case of two or more candidates obtaining equal marks in **NEET-PG-2024** the position in merit shall be decided by the National Board of Examinations based on the criterion notified in NEET 2024 Information Bulletin.

9. Admission

9.1 The Common/Centralized Counselling for admission to Postgraduate (MD/MS) Degree courses in various specialties shall be held online.

9.2 The following documents are required at the time of reporting for admission in the concerned Medical Colleges failing which admission will not be accepted by the concerned College:

- a. Provisional Allotment letter along with print out of application.
- b. **All Educational Certificates including Bachelor Degree (in Original) and other documents as per provision of the Prospectus.**
- c. Agreement Bond as per Appendix-6 as per the Government policy notified vide notification No. HFW- B(F)4-9/2017-II dated 27.2.2019.
- d. Affidavit to the effect not opting for the stipend. (For Direct /All India Quota candidates, if required).
- e. Affidavit to the effect that he/she will not leave the course after last cut off date of admission as prescribed by the competent authority failing which he/she shall pay Rs.10 Lakhs to the State Government for wastage of seat.
- f. Undated Cheque amounting to Rs. 40.00 Lakhs.
- g. Undated Cheque amounting to Rs. 10.00 Lakhs.

10. Terms and Conditions of Bond for Post-Graduation as per Provisions Prescribed in the PG Policy Notified by the Govt. Vide Notification No. Hfw-B(F)4-9/2017-Ii Dated 27.2.2019 :

10.1 As the Government incurs substantive expenditure on each candidate for doing Post Graduation and also pays them full pay along with all allowances and seniority during the course, every GDO (regular/contract) who have been sponsored to pursue Post Graduation within the State in Govt. and Pvt. Medical colleges shall have to furnish a bond as per Appendix-7 to serve the State for **at least four years** including mandatory first year of field posting after completion of their respective courses.

Since the direct candidate who pursues Post Graduation within the State in Government Medical college on State/All India Quota stand on a different footing as they are not entitled to service benefits including full pay (with allowances and increments) and chances of regularization to which their GDO counterparts are entitled; however, keeping in view the resources expended in their education by the Government including payment of stipend, every such direct candidates shall have to furnish a bond to serve the State for **at least two years** including mandatory first year of field posting after completion of their respective courses.

10.2 The bond as per clause 9.1 shall be in the following form:

- (i) All the candidates as per clause 9.1 shall furnish a bond in the form of a legal undertaking to serve the State for prescribed period failing which the candidate shall have to pay the Rs. 40 Lacs to the State Government. The candidate shall also furnish an undated cheque from a scheduled bank amounting to Rs. 40 Lacs in the name of Director of Health Services,

Himachal Pradesh. The Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh shall be at liberty to get the cheque encashed in event of violation of the bond conditions. The Bond should be signed by the Executive Magistrate.

- (ii) The candidates as per clause 9.1 shall also deposit their original bachelor degree with the Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh (in case of GDOs) and **concerned Principal** (in case of direct candidates). The concerned issuing University/Institution shall be informed about such retention and the candidate shall be debarred from obtaining any duplicate degree. The original bachelor degree shall be released only after completion of the Bond Period or after deposition of the requisite amount and this shall be a part of the bond agreement.
- (iii) The candidates shall also furnish undertaking as a part of bond that they shall complete the course prescribed failing which they shall be liable to pay Rs. 10 lakhs to the State Government for wastage of seat.
- (iv) The selected candidates are required to be deposited the undated cheque of Rs. 10:00 Lac in favour of Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh with the concerned Principal before joining the course
- (v) The prescribed format of the bond shall be as per **APPENDIX-8**. (The Bond should be signed by the Executive Magistrate).

10.3 It shall be the sole responsibility of Director for Health Services, Himachal Pradesh to ensure the furnishing of such documents from each GDO candidate who is being sponsored and the sole responsibility of the Principal of concerned College to ensure collection of these documents at the time of admission of a direct candidate to the course. Any dereliction of duty in this end shall make the concerned liable for action.

10.4 The custodian of these three documents –Bond as legal undertaking, undated cheque and the original Bachelor's degree shall be Director Health Services (in case of GDOs) and DME (in case of direct candidates through Principals of respective Colleges). Two months before the tentative completion of the Post Graduation in every Medical/Dental College, the Director Health Services shall conduct walk in interview in the concerned college and shall take options from all those candidates who are bonded to serve the state. Simultaneously, the Director Health Service shall take over the custody of the documents including the Bond agreement, undated Cheques and Original Bachelor degree in respect of direct candidates. The field posting orders of such candidates shall be issued by the Director Health Services within a month of declaration of PG results and successful clearing of the PG Exams subject to vacancy. The concerned Principals shall relieve the candidates (including GDOs and direct candidate) only after successful completion of the course with the direction to report to the Director Health Services.

10.5 In no case, NOC will be granted for second Post Graduation course/Super Specialty course/Senior Residency to any candidate during the mandatory period of service of the State after first Post-graduation. Permission may be granted for Super Speciality Course during mandatory period of service, after completing one year compulsory field posting subject to balance bond period as per Clause No. 9.1.

10.6 The following shall constitute a violation of the bond to serve the state as outlined in Clause

9.6.1 Failure to join the given field posting within 10 days of issuance of orders.

9.6.2 Putting in request for EOL/Study leave/request for NOC during the mandatory period of service of the State.

9.6.3 Putting in request for Senior Residency within the mandatory first year of field posting.

10.7 In the event of a candidate violating the terms of bond as outlined in clause 11.10, the following actions shall be initiated by the Director Health Services:

9.7.1 The salary paid to the candidate during sponsorship shall be recovered through due process of law.

9.7.2 The bond amount shall be recovered through due process of law. The cheque submitted by the candidate as a part of bond documents shall be en-cashed.

9.7.3 Initiation of disciplinary proceedings against the GDO candidate.

9.7.4 The original bachelor degree shall not be returned and endorsement shall be made to the concerned University thereof.

9.7.5 Cancellation of registration from the concerned Medical Council.

10.8 Exceptions: The condition of bond shall not be applicable in case of Direct candidate in the following scenarios:

9.8.1 Those direct candidates who do not choose to take any stipend during the post-graduation in the state. Such candidates shall furnish such option on a prescribed affidavit before the start of course.

9.8.2 Those direct candidates in whose case the Government/Director health Services, Himachal Pradesh fails to issue any orders for field postings within a month of their clearing the PG Exams. However, the Director of Health Services would be answerable to the Government for this lapse.

10 Remuneration during Post- Graduation:

- 10.1** GDOs appointed on contract basis and sponsored for pursuing post-graduation within the State as per clause 2.8 shall be paid the contractual salary as per their contract agreement.
- 10.2** Regular GDOs sponsored for pursuing post-graduation within the State and outside the State on sponsored quota seats of Autonomous Institutions as per clause 2.8 shall be treated on duty during the prescribed period of Post-Graduation and he/she shall be paid the regular pay, allowances including increments for such prescribed period. In case, the sponsored GDO is not able to complete the Post-Graduation within the prescribed time period, the extra period spent during Post Graduation beyond the prescribed period may be regularized against the leave of kind due. If there is no sufficient leave of kind due in his/her credit, that period shall be treated as EOL and the payment made to the person for this period shall be recovered from the candidates.
- 10.3** Direct candidates shall be paid stipend as applicable to them in Govt. Medical Colleges subject to the exception, if chosen for as per clause 9.8 , as per existing rates Rs.40,000/-, Rs.45,000/- and Rs.50,000/- per month for the first, second and third year of the course respectively.

11 Terms for Leaving Post-Graduation Course Midway:

- 11.1** If the GDO's who have been granted sponsorship for pursuing Post-Graduation within the State, leaves the Post-Graduation course midway, he/she shall be debarred to re-appear in any entrance examination for Post-Graduation for the next five years within and outside the State of Himachal Pradesh. The period of five years for the purpose of de-barring shall be reckoned from the date of leaving the course midway.
- 11.2** In addition to this, for those GDO's who leave post-graduation course mid-way, the period spent in the Medical College during Post-Graduation may be regularized against the leave of kind due. If there is no sufficient leave of kind due in his credit that period may be treated as EOL and the payment made to the person for this period shall be recovered from the candidates. In addition to this, the GDO shall have to pay Rs. 10 Lakhs in event of leaving the course midway as per terms of the bond.
- 11.3** In case of direct candidates who leave the course midway i.e. Last cut off date of admission for the academic session 2024-25 as prescribed by the competent authority or after completion of admission process), they shall have to pay Rs. 10 lakh to the State Government as per the terms of the bond. Information in respect of such cases shall be sent to the Director of Health Services, Himachal Pradesh by the concerned Principal along with bond and other documents. **He/ she shall refund entire stipend in lump sum and deposit the college fee for the remaining years of course within the period of one month failing which penal interest will be charged as per prevailing bank rates.**

12 Terms for Second Post- Graduation Course:

The GDOs who have been sponsored to pursue Post- Graduation within the state earlier and who are desirous of pursuing a second Post- Graduation Course shall be governed by the following conditions:

- 12.1** The GDO's who have completed PG degree in one Speciality shall not be granted sponsorship/NOC for pursuing PG degree in any other Speciality However, such candidates may pursue their second PG degree Course only after the grant of EOL by the Government as per CCS leave Rules.
- 12.2** The GDOs who have completed PG Diploma/DNB in one Speciality may be given NOC for pursuing PG Degree in the Speciality, only after serving the State for at least five years.(either in field postings or in Govt. Medical Colleges) after completion of PG Diploma /DNB.
- 12.3** The GDOs who have completed PG Diploma/DNB in one Speciality shall not be granted NOC for pursuing PG Degree/DNB/Diploma in any other Speciality. However, such candidates may pursue their second PG Degree Course only after the grant of EOL by the Government as per CCS (Leave) rules.

12.4 Any GDO who is fulfilling the condition of minimum required service to be sponsored as Post Graduate Candidate within or out of the State shall have to resign on their selection against direct/open seats before joining such courses. And, if he/she joins Post Graduation without getting NOC from the Government or without submitting his/her resignation, in case of contractual GDO his/her services shall be deemed terminated and recovery shall be made as per terms of contract agreement and in case of regular GDO candidate, disciplinary proceedings shall be initiated besides writing to the concerned Head of Institute for cancellation of the a admission.

Note: (i) **No candidate will be allowed to draw more than one stipend/scholarship/financial assistance etc.**

(ii) **All the Postgraduate Students, Direct and In-service Medical Officer shall be entitled for 30 days leave only per Academic Year during PG Course. No carry forward for leave shall be allowed.**

13 Medical examinations

The selected candidate for PG (MD/MS/DNB) course for the academic session 2024-25 (All India Quota/ In- Service/ Direct) must be medically fit, for which they are required to get themselves medically examined from the concerned Medical College and submit the Medical Certificate before joining the courses.

14 Fee and Hostel charges for Government Medical colleges

14.5 Examination fee will be as fixed by the affiliating University from time to time.

14.6 Postgraduate student residing in the Hostel shall have to vacate the Hostel after completion of course (36 months).. However, a grace period of 7 days will be given /allowed after the completion of the Clinical/Practical examination. In case candidate fails to vacate the Hostel beyond the prescribed period, he/she shall be liable for penal of rent @ 100/- per day for one month and 300/- per days subsequently.

15. Examination

Examination shall be as prescribed by National Medical Commission. It will consist of two parts:-

Part –A Thesis

Part -B Written Paper (theory), Clinical, Oral and Practical.

15.1 Part–A (Thesis)

1. Thesis shall be compulsory and shall embody the candidates own work under supervision of qualified teachers for the purpose as recommended by the National Medical Commission/ Medical Council of India.
2. The acceptance of the thesis shall be pre-condition for appearing in the final examination (Part - B). In case the thesis is neither rejected nor approved and revision is suggested the same may be submitted after appearing in Part-B but where the thesis is rejected the candidates will not be allowed to appear in part-till the outcome of fresh thesis.

15.2 Part-B (Theory, Clinical, Oral and Practical)

- There will be four theory papers in each specialty of 100 marks each to be answered in three hours.
- Oral, Practical and Clinical will follow theory papers in each subject. The Practical/Clinical examination will be 350 marks and 50 marks for Internal Assessment.
- If the candidate fails in part-B of M.D./M.S. examination, he/she can re-appear at the subsequent examination of Part-B without requiring to submit a fresh thesis.
- Candidate who fails to qualify will be allowed to re-appear as external candidate in subsequent examination of Part-B without requiring to submit a fresh thesis.

15.3 Result

- To pass examination a candidate will be required to get minimum of 50% marks in theory and oral and 50% in clinical and practical separately.
- A candidate who obtain 80% marks or above in aggregate in first attempt in a annual examination will be awarded distinction.
- Candidate who fail in the examination will be allowed to re-appear in the subsequent examination as external candidate on payment of the examination fee.

16. HIMACHAL PRADESH EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (PROHIBITION OF RAGGING) ACT 2009

1. No student shall indulge in ragging in any form, within or outside the premises of an educational institution.
2. Any person if on prima facie evidence is found guilty will be suspended from the educational institution.
3. On Conviction be punished with imprisonment for term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend fifty thousand or with both.
4. Will be expelled from the College/Institution.
5. Expelled student will not be admitted in any other Institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion.

Note: Any change/amendment in the Rules and Regulation made by the Govt./University/College as the case may be, shall be binding on the students.

17. UTILISATION OF STUDENT TUITION FEE, HOSTEL FEE, ADMISSION FEE, STUDENT FUND, MEDICAL FUND, DILAPIDATED FUND AND SPORTS FUND

8. Conveyance and boarding charges of outside lectures, prominent citizens, poets and artists etc. approved by the Principal.
9. Travelling allowance to persons invited to deliver lectures in the College or to preside over convocation or prize distribution function.
10. Expenditure incurred on staff and students when they go out to represent the College in sports or other contests.
11. Travelling allowance to college teams and members of the staff accompanying the teams on approved tours.
12. Daily allowance to the members of staff and students when they go out to represent the College in sports or other contests.
13. Refreshments and meal, at the time of friendly and/or University matches or the distinguished visitor at College functions.
14. Purchase of sports material pertaining to various games, watering, levelling, clearing and turfing of playgrounds and amenities for N.C.C if these exists in the institution.
15. Photographs of teams or executives of student's union.
16. Expenditure in connection with the award of college colours to distinguished players.
17. Purchase of stock register, cash books, etc. required for maintaining accounts pertaining to these funds.
18. Postage, telegrams, telephones and purchase of stationery pertaining to student's activities.
19. Expenditure in connection with award or prizes, at the annual sports prize distribution or the College convocation.
20. Expense on medical assistance rendered to members of sports teams when out of station.
21. Uniforms or other equipment's for members of various teams.
22. Publication of College Magazine.
23. Repair of Hostel furniture and other articles after constituting a committee.
24. The hostel funds will be utilized for the repair, maintenance and development of the hostels.
25. Payments of Inspection fee and other inspection related expenditures of the regulatory or affiliating agency.
26. Any other object connected with the student's activities of educational character as approved by the Principal.
